



Head north to shoot machine guns at the Arizona Last Stop, cruise down the world famous Las Vegas strip, or head south to Lake Havasu City to see the world famous London Bridge.

I SPY SPIKE

Spike, Needles' most famous resident, is at the Needles Regional Museum on historic Route 66 in Needles. Snoopy's brother is the creation of Charles Schultz who lived in Needles as a child and his dog's name was Spike. Come by for a photo with Spike.











Originally born as a railroad town encampment named Prescott Junction, Seligman was officially named in 1886 after Jesse Seligman, a railroad financier. After the decline and eventual delisting of the Route 66 from the United States Highway System in 1985, Angel Delgadillo (of Seligman) went on to found the Historic Route 66 Association of Arizona. Thus earning himself many nicknames including "the Guardian Angel of Route 66". Eventually Route 66 associations were founded in all eight US 66 states with similar goal: preserving the once-important road.





Kingman is known as The Heart of Historic Route 66 because the longest remaining preserved stretch of the famous all-American road, Route 66, runs through downtown. The Route 66 Museum is truly unique in that it is a museum of history, housed in a historical building that lighted the way for the earliest Route 66 travelers.

10 miles, 222 curves.... The history behind the

"MOHAVE RATTLESNAKE"



Between 1926 to 1952 US 66 was aligned directly through the Black Mountains on what is known as Mohave County Route 10 or the Oatman Highway. This brought it right thru the wild west mining town of Oatman, AZ. Also referred to as `Bloody 66`, the origin of the `Rattlesnake` nickname can be traced back to the 1970`s, with stories that say the name goes back even further than that. Legend has it that it was also called simply `the rattlesnake`, and `rattlesnake ridge` as well. The name came from the road's abundance of snake-like curves, and the inherent danger of not surviving if you `got bit by the rattlesnake`. At some point, "mohave" was added to the nickname to provide a geographical reference. Thereby

becoming known as the "Mohave Rattlesnake". The color green is used to represent the mohave green rattlesnake, that is native to the area. Other names for this road have also been documented, but no matter what you call it, be safe, and don't get bit.

"Oatman, Arizona was sparsely settled starting in 1863 when a small bit of gold was discovered in the surrounding Black Mountains. Not much came of the discovery until two lucky prospectors struck it rich in 1915, with a 10 million dollar claim. The town grew rapidly after that, and in the course of a single year, the tiny tent village became a bustling town of 3,500 people. In the 1920s and 30s, the population grew to around 10,000. A fire in 1921 burned down nearly every building in Oatman."



Needles' formation began when three railroads, Atlantic and Pacific Railroad, Southern Pacific Railroad and the Santa Fe Railroad joined together to form the 35th Parallel Transcontinental Railroad. In 1883, Needles became the home of the railroad workers, who helped build the railroad making coast-to-coast travel available to the newly developing West.

ROUTE 66 BIKE WEEK - NEEDLES

Route 66 Bike Week - Needles to Seligman and Beyond - will begin at the historic El Garces and Santa Fe Park on Route 66 in Needles. Needles Tourism will host the event on Friday, April 29, from 8am-3pm along with sponsors Marvin's Mary J and The Red Dog Saloon and Wagon Wheel Restaurant, both iconic Route 66 stops. Food will be offered by the Needles Eagles Aerie #2599 and music will be provided.

The Mother Road in Needles has several other noteworthy sights - Needles Regional Museum where Spike resides, Wayside Rest Stop, Veterans Memorial on Old National Trails Hwy, colorful murals on many of the historic buildings and BNSF Railroad that follows much of Route 66. Complimentary tours of the El Garces will be offered.

Come to Needles and travel on an original part of Route 66! We look forward to seeing you.



























